Dear Birt:

This will confirm our discussion regarding the information gathered by Brott during the last year in connection with the study of FM and studios.

Up until August 1, 1945, Brott's services were paid for equally by both stations, and we both understand that he put in more time in connection with engineering work on KOMO future plans than on KJR. After that date KOMO gave \$100.00 a month extra compensation for work which he was doing, but he still received one half of his previous remuneration from Birt F. Fisher.

This letter is Brott's authority to see that a file is prepared giving you a copy of the studies made on various FM sites, a part of which resulted in an application being filed on one site, so that all of the data is available to you for whatever purpose you may wish to put it. It is also authorization for Brott to give you a set of the preliminary studio plans and dimensions which he did in connection with new studios.

As you probably know we have had two architects also working on these plans, and this authorization does not cover plans and specifications which are being, or will be, prepared by our architects which in all cases have been paid for by KOMO. This does not mean that our studio plans are necessarily secret, or to be hidden under a bushel, but merely means we are not obligated to turn over details, specifications, or plans of anything other than what has been covered by work performed by Brott previous to November 1, 1945.
